THE NEW COLLEGE

The New College was established in 1951 and is affiliated to the University of Madras. Having completed 62 years of dedicated service to the nation, the college has earned an enviable reputation as a leading institution of higher education in Chennai.

The college founded by the Muslim Educational Association of Southern India (MEASI) with the primary aim of providing higher education to the educationally backward sections in general and Muslim students in particular. However, its doors are open to deserving students irrespective of community, caste, creed or socioeconomic considerations. With a humble beginning of 200 students in the intermediate course, it has grown to the current combined strength of over 5000 students in the Aided & Self-financed streams. The College offers 12 UG, 7 PG, 7 M.Phil and 6 Ph.D Courses in Shift-I (Aided) and 9 UG and 6 PG courses in Shift-II (Self finance) spanning Arts, Commerce & Science programmes.

The New College was first accredited by NAAC with B++ in 2005. UGC conferred Autonomous status to the College in 2007. The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) recommended by TANSCHE was introduced in 2008. These have helped the college to focus on Quality and holistic education of students, carry out many academic innovations in curriculum design, conduct of examination and evaluation and groom students who are more employable with requisite life and personality skills. The College was re-accredited by NAAC in 2010 with the highest 'A' grade and CGPA of 3.18 on a scale of 4.00. The College has achieved several significant milestones. It was selected by UGC in 2004, to offer Career Oriented Add-on programmes in Clinical Laboratory Technology (Certificate, Diploma & Advanced Diploma courses), Computer Assembly & Servicing and Quantitative methods & Computer Applications.

The College is one of the most preferred educational institutions in Chennai due to its central location, excellent infrastructure, dedicated teaching staff and emphasis on "Teaching beyond the classroom and beyond the curriculum", The curriculum includes modules on Deeniyath and Moral instructions, Computer skills. Personality enrichment, Soft skills and Environmental studies which help in the integrated/holistic development of the individual. The College has a "remedial coaching scheme" for students who are academically weak, "students counselling programme" with a dedicated class counsellor to mentor and monitor the progress of the students and an English language lab to train students in communication skills. It has an active career guidance and placement cell which has facilitated the successful placement of students in many reputed concerns.

The New College Alumni have excelled in various spheres of life - Bureaucracy, Public and Social service, Judiciary, Business, Industry, Medicine, Scientific research, Fine arts, Cinema, Sports, Entrepreneurship etc. The College strives to produce well-moulded graduates with stress on academic intellect, leadership, team building, spiritual, moral and ethical orientation.

The College, since becoming autonomous, has constituted the following committees to ensure proper management of academic, financial and general administrative affairs:

- Governing Body
- · Academic Council
- Board of Studies
- Finance Committee

Governing Body: It is responsible for the overall governance and administration of the college. It includes representatives from the management, senior teachers, educationists / industrialists, nominee of the UGC, state government and the university with the principal as the ex-officio member.

Academic Council: It is responsible for all academic matters such as framing of academic policy, approval of courses, regulations and syllabi. The composition of this council includes the Principal, all heads of departments, four senior teachers of the college, four experts from outside the college nominated by the Governing body, three nominees of the university and a faculty member nominated by the Principal.

Board of Studies: It is the basic constituent of the academic system of an autonomous colleges and its functions include framing the syllabi for various courses, reviewing and updating syllabi, for various courses, reviewing and updating syllabi, introducing new courses of study determining details of continuous assessment etc.

<u>Finance Committee</u>: It will advise the Governing body on financial matters.

College Council: Its function is to advice the Principal on the internal affairs of the College. The College Council consists of the Principal, Professors in-charge (Shift-I & Shift-II), Controller of Examinations, Bursar, all the Heads of the Departments, Senior most Associate Professor of the Departments, President, Secretary and Treasurer of the New College Staff Association, N.C.C. & N.S.S. Officers, Deputy Warden and members of staff who are in the Academic Council and Senate of the University of Madras.

The Fee is payable not later than the fifth working day of each term from the date of commencement of the term or the day fixed for payment.

If a student fails to pay his fees on or before the day fixed for payment, a fine of Rs. 50/- for every working day will be levied and if the fee is not paid within the stipulated dates, the student's name shall be truck off the rolls. If re-admitted, he must in addition to the fees and find due, pay a re-admission fee of Rs. 200/-. He will lose attendance for the days for which he was not on the rolls of the college.

Students withdrawing from the college, during the course shall be required to pay the tuition fees and special fees due for the term. They cannot claim a remission of any portion of the fee.

SCHOLARSHIP

The following scholarships are available for the students. Students are directed to meet the class counselor / scholarships clerk in the office for more details on various scholarships. They are also advised to regularly read the notices regarding scholarships displayed on the Notice Boards.

 National merit-cum-means scholarships to students belonging to minority communities. A minimum of 50% marks in the qualifying examination is required for applicants. (As the number of scholarships is limited, the selection of eligible candidates may be done on the basis of the marks scored by the applicants in their qualifying examination). This scholarship is available for UG, PG, M.Phil, and Ph.D. courses. Annual income limit. Rs. 1,00,000/-

- National Loan Scholarship for UG and PG students belonging to SC and ST. The applicants should have scored minimum of 50% in the qualifying examination. This scholarship is available only for students staying in reputed/approved hostels. Annual income limit: Rs. 1,00,000/-
- Scholarship for the physically challenged (i.e., students who are deaf / hearing impaired, visually and, Orthopedically challenged). Annual Income limit: Rs. 1,00,000/-
- Residential and non-residential state scholarships for students belonging to SC, ST, and those converted from Hinduism to Christianity: They should be natives of Tamil Nadu or domiciled therein. Annual Income limit: Rs. 2,00,000/- for SC., ST., and Rs. 1,00,000/- for Christian converts.
- Pondicherry state Post-Metric scholarship for students who had their school education in the Union Territory of Pondicherry.
- Directorate of Tribal Affairs, Government of Manipur, gives Post-Metric scholarships for students from Manipur state.
- Administration of the Government of Union Territory of Lakshadweep, Kochi, gives scholarships for students from the Lakshadweep group of Islands.
- Directorate of Higher Education, Kohima, Nagaland, gives Post-Metric scholarships for students from Nagaland state.
- Students belonging to the family of farmer's community are eligible for scholarships under Tamil Nadu Agricultural Laborers – Farmer's Welfare Scheme, offered by the Directorate of Collegiate Education Tamil Nadu.
- Scholarships for Physically challenged students who are natives of Tamil Nadu and whose parent's income does not exceed Rs. 1,00,000/-
- The Directorate of Collegiate Education, Tamil Nadu, gives scholarship (stipend) to full time Ph.D., scholars from all disciplines.
- 12. Ministry of Human Resource Development gives scholarships to students with extraordinary academic achievements in the qualifying examinations (80% and above), through the Directorate of Collegiate Education, Tamil Nadu.

- Indian Council of Cultural Relations (ICCR), Government of India, gives scholarships to UG and PG students from Sri Lanka.
- Ministry of Labour, Government of India, gives scholarships to the children of Beedi / Mine / Cine workers form Tamil Nadu.
- 15. Secondary Grade Teachers Children Scholarship is given to the Children of Secondary Grade Teachers working in Government Recognized Primary and Middle Schools for pursuing M.A., M.Sc., M.Com., M.Ed., M.L., M.C.A., M.Phil courses in Tamilnadu. There is no income ceiling limit, but the students should have secured not less than 60% marks in the U.G. Courses. Selection is made on the merit basis.
- 16. Scholarships for the first-generation students from backward classes. Annual income limit: Rs. 1,00,000/-. A certificate from the Tahsildar to the effect that there is no graduate in the family has to be produced.
- 17. Muslim Educational Association of Southern India (MEASI), the parent body of The New College, awards scholarships to poor and deserving Muslim students pursuing unaided courses in the Day College and all UG and PG course in the Evening College.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR STUDENTS

Students will have to attend all classes regularly. The following are the Attendance Regulations of the college.

- A student shall attend all the five periods of each working day.
 Attendance shall be taken every period as soon as the teacher enters the class. As the attendance slips are collected from the classes immediately after the commencement of the classes, late comers will not be marked present. The attendance passion of the each student will be displayed on the Department notice boards every month.
- Students who want to avail leave should submit their leave applications, preferably in advance, to the respective class counsellors.
- Students have to produce medical certificates if the leave on medical grounds exceeds three days.

- 4. If a student absents himself from classes for more than a week without prior permission from the class counselor and Head of the Department, his name will be removed from the rolls. A re-admission fees will be levied for the reinstatement of the names in the rolls.
- A minimum of 75% of attendance is required for all the students. In the case of I year students the minimum required percentage of attendance is 80%.
- 6. According to University of Madras regulations, a Candidate will be permitted to appear for the End-Semester examinations only if he secures not less than 75% of attendance in each part of the course of study (Part I, Part III, Part III and Part IV) during the semester. A student who secures between 65% and 75% of attendance must pay the prescribed condonation fee and receive the permission fee and receive the permission fee and receive the permission orders to write the exam. Those who have attendance between 50% and 65% must pay the prescribed condonation fee and get permission to write the examinations in the next semester. Students who hold less than 50% of attendance will have to repeat the semesters for which they lack attendance after the completion of the course, and appear for the examination after securing the required percentage of attendance.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

The following are the general code of conduct for the students. Any act of indiscipline inside or outside the college may attract strict action.

- All students must carry their Identity Cards during the college hours. They are required to show their ID cards to the security personnel near the college gate and the college staff (both teaching & non-teaching) whenever demanded. Loss of Identity Cards should be reported to the Principal or the Professor-in-Charge immediately.
- Every student is expected to come to college suitably dressed.
 T-shirts (with or without collar) and Shorts etc. are not allowed.
- 3. Students are expected to exhibit good manner and refined behavior. They should use decent language and abstain

themselves from using profane language, offensive body language and any form of discriminatory expressions. They are expected to be courteous and polite in dealing with fellow students, faculty members and administrative staff. The college expects high moral standards in the students, and so students are advised to inculcate moral values.

- Ragging is a criminal offence. Ragging of any kind is strictly prohibited inside/outside the college. A student found guilty of this crime is liable to be expelled from the college.
- Mobile phones are strictly banned in classrooms, library and examination halls. The defaulters will be fined.
- Students are forbidden from organizing or attending any meeting inside the college campus or collecting money for any purpose without prior permission from the Principal.
- Students are not permitted to enroll themselves as members of any political parties nor are they allowed to take part/organize if any political agitations inside or outside the campus.
- The college campus has been declared as a "No Smoking Zone". Strict disciplinary action will be taken against students found indulging in smoking.
- Students are expected to uphold academic integrity. They should not indulge in plagiarism, malpractice/cheating on exams, abuse of electronic resources and other dishonest activities.
- 10. If any student is found to have engaged in any unlawful activities inside or outside the campus, he /she will be dealt with in accordance with the rule of law in the state and the country, and such students will be suspended / dismissed from the college. The college will not take responsibility for any criminal or non-criminal acts committed by students of the college outside the college campus.
- Possession/use of drugs, alcohol and other intoxicants is strictly banned in the college campus.
- The college Canteen facility is available only to the staff and students of the college. Students may each only in the

- canteen. Littering on the college premises is a punishable offence.
- Stringent action will be taken if students are found writing and drawing on walls and desks, damaging / defacing college or public property.
- Students are not permitted to park their vehicle in the parking areas allotted for the staff.
- Misconduct with teaching and other supporting staff of the college will be strictly dealt with.
- Students are not permitted to carry weapons of any kind or replicas of weapons on the college Campus at any time.
- The Wi-Fi connectivity available in the college campus should only be used to access academic related materials and information from the internet.
- Students committing Cyber Crimes (illegal activities on the internet) will face disciplinary action including suspension / dismissal from the college.
- Possessing / watching pomographic materials / videos/photos on mobile phones, Tablet Computers and other devices is strictly banned inside the campus.
- Eating, chewing and drinking beverages other that water are strictly forbidden inside the class during class hours.
- Women students pursuing M.Phil., Ph.D., and other
 programmes are expected to conduct themselves with
 dignity, modesty and simplicity. They must come to college
 suitably clad.
- 22. Students should not engage in any trade or business activities within the college premises.
- Character and conduct certificates cannot be claimed as a matter of right. The principal may refuse to issue these certificates without assigning any reason.
- Students may meet or write to the Principal or Professor-in-Charge for redressing their grievances.
- Students are advised to make use of the free periods in reading books, magazines and newspapers available in the library/reading room.

- 26. Students must read the Circulars displayed on the Notice Boards regularly. Ignorance of orders duly displayed on the Notice Boards shall not be accepted as an excuse for non-compliance. Notices/posters regarding employment opportunities and training programmes supplied by various organizations will be displayed only on the Notice Board of the Career Guidance and Placement Cell located in the ground floor of the Library Block.
- 27. Students are warned against harassing, threatening, abusing or intimidating of fellow students, visitors, staff and others inside the campus. Students engaging in these activities will be seriously dealt with.

Note: Under the Government Educational Rules the Principal has full power to inflict the following punishment:

Fine, withholding of Certificates, Suspension and Expulsion.

Shit-I

All the students of the college are members of the College Union. For each Department there is an Association for promoting academic excellence of the students. The Principal shall be the exofficio President of the College Union and Sectional Associations. The Vice-President of Sectional Associations shall be nominated by the respective department among the members of the staff of the Departments.

Students detained from appearing for Term End Examinations for want of required percentage of attendance or for want of academic progress are not eligible to contest Sectional Association elections.

The Secretaries of the above Sectional Association are eligible to elect from among themselves a Chairman, a Vice-chairman and a General Secretary for the College Students' Union.

All UG students eligible to vote for the respective sectional Association. The PG students are eligible to vote only for PG Association.

Shift II

There is a separate College Union for the Self Financing Courses. For each of the following Departments there is a sectional Association with a vice president and student secretary.

Commerce, Corporate Secretaryship, Computer science, Computer Applications, Information Systems and Management, Visual Communication, Business Administration and Bank Management.

In addition to these Association, there is a separate Association for the PG students of the Evening College.

STUDENTS' COUNSELLING SCHEME

The Student Counsellor will serve as the local guardian of the students in the college. There is a Students' Counselling Scheme in the college to help the students and discover the latent talent in them and channelize their energy. The aim of the scheme is overall development of a student once he enters the portals of the college. The programme facilitates a group of student to be under the personal care and guidance of a faculty member who would constantly monitor the activities of the students in all respects. Students belonging to each discipline shall be divided into small groups and each shall be kept under the charge of a Staff member of the Department.

The scheme also aims at bridging the gap between the teacher and the taught. Students are advised to make use of this counseling scheme available in their respective Departments for the betterment of their academic pursuit, personality and discipline in a friendly atmosphere. A progress report will be sent by the Principal to the Parents or Guardians at the end of the Term-end and Model Examinations. The Principal would take into consideration the reports of the Heads of the Departments or Counsellors while issuing Academic, Attendance, Conduct and other certificates.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Every student of the I year Degree class shall be required to undergo the course of physical training prescribed by the college and his annual attendance and progress certificates shall not be considered complete unless the Principal has certified on the report of the Director of Physical Education that the student has satisfactorily undergone the prescribed course in physical training and put in three-fourths of the attendance in addition to the usual course of instruction.

No student will be exempted from the course of physical training except such students as may have been declared by the Medical Officer of the College to be unfit to undergo a course of physical training and approved by the university.

MEDICAL INSPECTION

I Year U.G. & P.G. students have to undergo Medical Inspection without fail. Students who fail to do so are not eligible to write the examinations.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS

The College provides training to students in the N.C.C. in the Infantry Wing and Armored squadron. Enrolment of cadets is made soon after admission to the college.

Smart and capable cadets are entitled to selection for Adventure course, All India Advance Leadership Camps. Summer Training Camps of other States, training in the Himalayan Mountaineering Institute, Republic Day Parade contingent at New Delhi etc. Outstanding cadets are entitled to selection for going abroad under Youth Exchange Programme.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is a programme organized by the Ministry of Education and Youth Services of the Government of India to offer opportunities and training in service to the community and the nation for students with an aptitude. It is intended to involve the college students in a variety of social service and developmental activities concomitantly with the normal academic programme. The motto of the scheme is "Education through Community Service".

Students of the first and second year Degree classes are eligible for admission. A total of 400 students will be enrolled in our college units which will be under the control of three Programme Officers.

The NSS aims to develop in its volunteers:

- A spirit of selfless service to our people in distress, poverty and ignorance, irrespective of region, language, religion and
- A capacity to identify and study community problems, to plan and to carry out welfare projects as a team.

- A willingness to share the benefits of modern higher education with our people who did not get this benefit.
- A dignity for manual work and respect and concern for our rural masses and
- A living faith in the unity of India and our great national heritage.

NEST

The New College Centre for Environment Science and Technology (NEST) is a science club whose aims and objectives are the following:

- (a) To educate the masses and create environmental awareness among them.
- (b) To device methods for the safe and effective disposal of pollutants and to develop indigenous technology for solid waste management like vermin compost.
- (c) To create awareness on Green House Effect and Global Warming
- (d) To develop new techniques for Rain Water Harvesting (RWH).

The First year UG and the First year PG students of Science departments alone are eligible to enroll themselves as members of NEST. "Young Scientist" and "Enviro Friend" titles would be conferred each year on the outstanding members of the club.

DEENIYATH & MORAL INSTRUCTION CLASSES

The Muslim Educational Association of Southern India organizes Deeniyath Classes for the students of U.G. and P.G. Degree courses in the College. All the Muslim Students are expected to attend these classes regularly.

Moral instruction classes are conducted for other students.

Under the auspices of Deeniyath & Moral Instruction programme common quest lectures are conducted.

Apart from Annual examinations, contests and essay writing competitions are conducted every year and prizes are awarded.

Students who put in 100% of attendance in Deeniyath & Moral Instruction classes will be awarded cash prizes.

e-Urdu Centre

The Department of Urdu, The New College (Autonomous), Chennai – 14. recently opened the e-Urdu Centre to promote Urdu language in general and to impart IT related skills in Urdu in particular.

Objectives of the Centre

- To promote urdu language among staff and students of the college.
- To train students in DTP and other IT related skills in Urdu language.
- To offer add-on Diploma and Certificate Courses in Urdu language for students.

CAREER GUIDANCE CELL

A career guidance cell is opened at the College General Library premises. A team of Professors will guide the students regarding career opportunities.

The cell offers guidance to all students of this college belonging to various faculties to choose a bright and right career.

The objectives of the cell are as follows:

- (a) To provide training for the students to improve their skill to face various competitions.
- (b) To arrange seminars and meetings to enthuse and encourage the students in planning for their future.
- (c) To hold campus selections, interviews organized by various institutions of repute.
- (d) To offer guidance for various Civil Service Examinations conducted both by the Centre and State Governments.
- (e) To provide database of the students sought by various companies.

UNIVERSITY STUDENTS' INFORMATION BUREAU

Students requiring information on further studies in India and abroad and on scholarships offered by State and Central Governments and organizations like the UNESCO, the British Council and the US Government are advised to contact the Information Bureau Secretary at the University Building, Chepauk, Chennai – 600 005.

LIBRARY

The College Library, including general and department libraries, contains 88,967 volumes. The departmental libraries are under the charge of the professors concerned and books are issued according to the special rules framed by them.

The books in the library are classified and arranged according to the Decimal Classification System.

The library receives regularly 82 outstanding periodicals-2 foreign periodicals, newspapers and 28 journals. They are placed in the reading room for the use of students.

Students and teaching staff of the College are entitled to use the library.

The library and the reading room will be kept open from 8.30 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. and from 2.00 p.m. to 6.30 p.m. on all working days. Strict silence should be observed in the library at all times.

Books will be issued from 08.30 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. and from 2.00 p.m. to 6.00 p.m. on all working days.

An under-graduate student will be provided with one borrower's ticket which entitles him to borrow one book and a post-graduate student with two tickets against which he can borrow two books.

A member borrowing a book from the library shall be fully responsible for its safe custody. In the event of any damage or loss he shall replace it with a new copy of the book or pay such compensation as may be decided by the Principal.

If books are returned after the due date, the tickets will be handed over to the member only if an overdue charge per book per day is paid.

A member against whom overdue or other charges are outstanding will not be allowed to borrow books.

Books may be renewed for a further period of a fortnight provided that:

- (i) The application for renewal reaches the Librarian three days before the due date.
- (ii) No other reader has applied for the book in the meantime.
- (iii) Not more than one renewal has been made previously for the same book.

Library books, periodicals, maps, etc., should not be marked, written upon or damaged. Taking clippings from periodicals and any other form of mutilation of library property is strictly forbidden.

Students will be entitled, subject to rules, to keep books for two weeks from the date of issue.

The Librarian has the right to check each student before he leaves the library to find out whether he carries any books of the library without the knowledge of the Librarian.

The Librarian, the attendants and the readers shall be responsible individually or collectively for any loss or damage done to the books or other property belong to the library either intentionally or otherwise. The Principal's decision on this matter will be final.

A member who has lost his borrower's ticket shall make a written report to the Librarian. A period of one month will be allowed to the member to trace and return the ticket. If after this period, if still untraceable, an undertaking in writing shall be given to the effect that the member will hold himself responsible for any unauthorized borrowing in exchange or the lost ticket. On such an understand being given, a duplicate ticket will be issued on payment of Rs. 5/-.

STUDENTS' BOOK-BANK

Students' Book-Bank is a special section attached to the main library. Books will be issued on loan to deserving students for one — academic year. Current text books on all subjects are available on loan. There are about 18820 books in the Bank.

The object of the scheme is to provide text books to poor and deserving students.

Applicant should submit a certificate from a responsible officer stating that the annual income of the parent or guardian does not exceed Rs. 50,000/- The application form for the Book-Bank will be issued on the specific orders of the Principal. A nominal fee of Rs. 1/- will be charged for each form. Prescribed application forms may be had from the library, on payment of the prescribed fee at the college counter and production of the receipt.

Books will be issued from 12 noon to 1.30 p.m. on all working days. Not more than five books will be issued to any student.

A student borrowing books from the Book-Bank shall be fully responsible for their safe custody. The book should not be marked, written upon or damaged. In the event of any damage or loss he shall replace it with a new copy of the books or pay such compensation as may be decided by the Principal . The borrowers are not allowed to sub-lend the book.

All books on loan must be returned before the commencement of End Semester Examinations. If the books are not returned in time, the student will not be eligible to borrow books in future. His original certificates submitted at the time of admission will not be returned to him unless he produces a "No Dues" certificate from the Librarian.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE

The College brings out a magazine "Al-jadeed" every year.

There is an Editorial Board of the College Magazine with the
Principal as the Chief Editor. The Principal will nominate some
members of staff as members of the Editorial Board.

RAILWAY SEASON TICKET CERTIFICATE

Students should apply for season ticket certificate in the prescribed form at least a week in advance. Railway concession certificate are also issued to students for going to their native places during Term-end and Summer holidays.

ENDOWMENT PRIZE

Prof.Dr.N. Pandurangan memorial Prize:

An endowment was created in the name of late Prof.N. Pandurangan, former Head of the Department of Tamil by the M.G.R. Mandram by donating Rs. 50,000/- which was deposited in the Unit Trust. Out of the dividend received, two prizes are awarded every year, one to the best outgoing M.A. Tamil Student and the other to the best U.G. Student who scores the highest marks in Tamil language in the previous End Semester Examination.

HOSTEL

The Hostel Committee will consist of the Principal, the Deputy Warden and two Senior Members of the Staff nominated by the Principal. They will hold atleast one meeting every month to pass the accounts, to formulate policies are regards maintenance of the discipline etc. The committee will be assisted by the resident superintendents, who shall be the member of the college staff.

The Hostel shall be under the direct control of the Principal of the college who is the ex-officio warden of the hostel. Subject to the approval of the warden, the Dy. Warden shall make by laws for the effective internal management of the hostel.

Students who want accommodation in the hostel should obtain the necessary application form from the hostel office on payment of Rs.500/- and apply after getting admission in the college and enrolled therein. Students joining hostel shall pay the following fees.

There is provision only for non-vegetarian mess. Monthly expenses for a boarder would be about Rs. 1,800/-

Cards regarding monthly hostel dues will be send directly to the parents or guardian. They should remit the dues to the Office before the 10th of every month.

NEW COLLEGE ALUMNITRUST

Former students of the college who have been on the rolls of the college are eligible for membership of the trust. The object of the trust is to maintain among the members an active interest in the welfare of their Alma Mater. Students joining the College are requested to become members. They are requested to contact the college office for any clarification in this regard.

EXAM AND EVALUATION UNDER CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

Regulations from 2008-2009

All UG and PG Courses shall be conducted on Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) it is an instructional package developed to suit the needs of students to keep pace with the developments in Higher Education and the quality assurance expected of it in the light of liberalization and Globalization in higher education.

The term "Credit" refers to the weightage given to a course, usually in relation to the instructional hours assigned to it. However, in no instance the credits of the course can be greater than the hours allotted to it. Each course is designed under lectures / tutorials / laboratory or field work / seminar / practical training / Assignments / Report writing etc., to meet effective teaching and learning needs.

Non Major Electives during III and IV Semester 2 papers with 2 credit each are taken. It is open to all the students, irrespective of the Department. In case of languages the students who study Arabic, Hindi, French and Urdu will study one paper on Fundamentals of Tamil during III & IV semesters. The Students who have studied Tamil in Higher Secondary School and taken other language as Part — I will have advanced Tamil. Others will study other Non Major Electives.

Extra Curricular Courses include activities of the NSS, NCC, Youth Red Cross, Rotaract Club and Sports. All the students have to involve themselves in any one of the extension services for the first four semesters. This will carry 1 credit.

Examinations:

- 1 There shall be Examinations at the end of each Semester, for odd Semester in the month of October / November and for even semester in the month of April /May.
- 2 A Student who does not pass the examination in any course(s) may be permitted to appear in such failed course(s) in the subsequent examination to be held in October /November or April /May. However students who have arrears in Practical shall be permitted to take their arrear Practical examinations in the respective semester.
- 3 A student should get registered for the first semester examination, if registration is not possible owing to shortage of attendance beyond condonation limit /regulation prescribed or belated joining or on medical grounds, the students are permitted to move to the next semester. Such students shall redo the missed semester after completion of the course.
- 4 PG students shall be required to take up Project Work and submit the Project Report during the second year. The Head of the Department shall allot the guide who in turn will suggest the project Work to the students. Two typed copies of the Project Report shall be submitted to the department before the due date and one copy will be forwarded to the Controller of Examinations.
- 5 For the Project Report, the maximum marks will be 75 percent and for the Viva-Voce 25 percent (if in some programmes, if the project is equivalent to more than one course, the project marks would be in proportion to the number of equivalent courses). Each student shall be required to appear for Viva-Voce Examination (in defense of the Project only).
- 6 Each PG student shall appear for an internship training during the vacation of II Semester for a minimum period of 15 days and shall submit the report to the controller of examinations, Each student is allotted 2 credit on submission of the report.

Condonation:

Students must have 75% of attendance in each part of the course of study to appear for the Examinations. Students who have 65% to 74% of attendance shall apply for condonation in the prescribed form with the prescribed fee and receive the permission orders to write the Exam. Students who have 50% to 65% of attendance must pay the prescribed condonation and get permission to write the Examinations in the next semester. Students who have below 50% of attendance are not eligible to appear for the examination. They shall redo the semester(s) after completion of the course and appear for the Examination after securing required percentage of attendance.

Examination Fees

Examination fees without fine or with fine of Rs. 500/should be paid on or before the prescribed dates for each semester.

No extension of date will be entertained under any circumstances.

Evaluation

The performance of a student in each course is evaluated in terms of percentage of marks with a provision for conversion to grade points. Evaluation for each course shall be done by continuous internal assessment by the course teacher concerned as well as by an end semester examination and will be consolidated at the end of the course.

The components for continuous internal assessment are:

UG & PG 2014 Batch onwards

Test & Model - 12 Marks
Assignment - 8 Marks
Regularity - 5 Marks

Total - 25 Marks

In addition to continuous evaluation component, the end semester examination, which will be a written – type examination of at least 3 hours duration, would form an integral component of the evaluation. The ratio of marks to be allotted to continuous internal assessment and to end semester examination is 25:75

The procedures for the conduct of the Semester Examination and valuation will be evolved by the office of the Controller of Examination.

Classes will be awarded separately for Part I, Part II and Part III. Mark alone will be awarded for Part IV. Credit will be awarded for Part V courses. Marks obtained in Part –III Allied Courses, Core Courses, Elective Courses will be taken into consideration for awarding the class in the overall performance of the student with grading system.

Passing Minimum for candidates admitted from 2014 -15 batch

There is no passing minimum for CIA Marks (25). The passing minimum for End semester Exam shall be 40% of 75 marks (30 marks) and overall pass is 40%. In PG course, a candidate shall be declared to have passed in each course if he secures not less than 50% out of 75% (38 marks) in the End Semester Examinations and not less than 50% in the aggregate, taking Continuous assessment and End Semester Examinations mark together.

Instant Examination

UG/PG Students with arrear in only one paper of final semester will be permitted to write the instant exam on the payment of Rs. 1000/- for that paper. The Instant exam will be normally conducted within 15 days of declaration of results of the final semesters. However, the re –do and mal practice cases, if any, are not eligible to appear for Instant exam.

Grading

Once the marks of the CIA and semester Examinations for Each Course are available, they will be added. The marks thus obtained will then be graded.

Total performance within a semester and continuous performance starting from the first semester are indicated by Grade Point Average (GPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA).

Grievance Redressal Cell

The functions are:

- (a) To deal with matters relating to the redressal of genuine and valid grievances of the students concerning all academic and examination related matters and suggest corrective measures.
- (b) To make a systematic enquiry into any written complaint lodged by any student regarding his/her continuous internal assessment or Final examination marks and suggests appropriate corrective actions.
- (c) The students are informed that there will be a Grievance Letter box in the General Library.
- (d) The letter of Grievance should contain the name, roll number, class of the student and should be duly signed with date. The letter of grievance may be handed over to the Convenor, in person or dropped in the grievance letterbox.
- (e) The convenor shall collect and number the letter serially, go through the letter and arrange for the redressal of grievance of the students and report the same in the monthly meeting of Grievance Appeal Committee to be convened on the first Monday of every month. The Genuine Grievance will be properly redressed.

DISCIPLINARY ACTION ON MALPRACTICE IN EXAMINATION

- The student will not indulge in any form of malpractice during C.I.A. Tests and End Semester Examinations.
- The student will be disqualified from the examination if he writes examination with Mobile Phone and keeping the same with or without knowledge of the invigilator.
- The following punishments will be given to the students, when they indulge in malpractices in C.I.A. test and Semester Examinations.
 - Possession of notes, books, bits of any incrminating material but not attempted to copy:

- The Particular examination paper will be cancelled.
- Attempting to copy from the material in possession and accepting the malpractice:

The particular paper and the subsequent papers will be cancelled.

- If a candidate repeats the malpractice, the punishments will be decided by Examinations Disciplinary Committee.
- 4. For any other type of malpractice, the punishments will be decided by Examination Disciplinary Committee.

IQAC

Based on the recommendation of the NAAC, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell has been formed at The New College. The cell monitors the quality parameters in the College and ensures that the standards of the excellence reflected in the vision and mission of the college are met and sustained.

Students Placement Cell

The cell acts as a platform to create opportunities for our students to be placed in the various companies at national and global level. This cell is headed by a Campus Placement Officer. This cell organizes campus recruitment drive for part time and full time job offers for our students. It also offers leadership and training programmes for the students.

Anti Ragging Committee

An Anti Ragging Committee has been formed in the college. Students indulging in ragging activities are liable to be punished under the orders of Central and State Governments and the University of Madras. Incidents of ragging or attempted ragging on the college campus should be reported to the convener of anti ragging committee.
