#### THE NEW COLLEGE

The New College was established in 1951 and is affiliated to the University of Madras. Having completed 64 years of dedicated service to the nation, the college has earned an envible reputation as a leading institution of higher education in Chennai. The college was founded by the Muslim Educational Association of Southern India (MEASI) with the primary aim of providing higher education to the educationally backward sections in general and Muslim students in particular. However, its doors are open to deserving students irrespective of community, caste, creed or socioeconomic considerations. With a humble beginning of 200 students in the intermediate course, it has grown to the current combined strength of over 5000 students in the Aided & Self-financed streams. The College offers 12 UG, 7 PG, 7 M.Phil and 8 Ph.D Courses in Shift-I (Aided) and 9 UG and 5 PG courses in Shift-I (Self finance) spanning Arts, Commerce & Science programmes.

The New College was first accredited by NAAC with B+ + in 2005. The UGC conferred Autonomous status to the College in 2007. The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) recommended by TANSCHE was introduced in 2008. These have helped the college to focus on quality and holistic education of students, carry out many academic innovations in curriculum design, conduct of examination and evaluation and groom students who are more employable with requisite life and personality skills. The College was re-accredited by NAAC in 2010 (2nd Cycle) with 'A' grade and CGPA of 3.18 and 3.08 in 2016 (3rd Cycle) on a scale of 4.00. The College has passed several significant milestones. It was selected by UGC in 2004, to offer Career Oriented Add-on programmes in Clinical Laboratory Technology (Certificate, Diploma & Advanced Diploma courses), Computer Assembly & Servicing and Quantitative methods & Computer Applications.

A large number of students have enrolled in the college NCC and NSS Units.

The College is one of the most preferred educational institutions in Chennai due to its central location, excellent infrastructure, dedicated teaching staff and emphasis on "Teaching beyond the classroom and beyond the curriculum", The curriculum includes modules on Deeniyath and Moral instructions, Computer skills. Personality enrichment, Soft skills and Environmental studies which help in the integrated/holistic development of the individual. The College has a "remedial coaching scheme" for students who are academically weak, a "students counselling programme" with a dedicated class counsellor to mentor and monitor the progress of the students and an English language lab to train students in communication skills. It has an active Career Guidance and Placement Cell which has facilitated the successful placement of students in many reputed concerns.

The New College Alumni have excelled in various spheres of life - Bureaucracy, Public and Social service, Judiciary, Business, Industry, Medicine, Scientific research, Fine arts, Sports, Entrepreneurship, etc. The College strives to produce well-moulded graduates with stress on academic intellect, leadership, team building, spiritual, moral and ethical orientation.

The College, since becoming autonomous, has constituted the following committees to ensure proper management of academic, financial and general administrative affairs:

- Governing Body
- Academic Council
- Board of Studies
- · Finance Committee
- College Council

Governing Body: It is responsible for the overall governance and administration of the college. It includes representatives from the management, senior teachers, educationists / industrialists, nominee of the UGC, state government and the university with the principal as the ex-officio member.

Academic Council: It is responsible for all academic matters such as framing of academic policy, approval of courses, regulations and syllabi. The composition of this council includes the Principal, all heads of departments, four senior teachers of the college, four experts from outside the college nominated by the Governing body, three nominees of the university and a faculty member nominated by the Principal.

Board of Studies: It is the basic constituent of the academic system of an autonomous college and its functions include framing the syllabi for various courses, reviewing and updating syllabi for various courses, introducing new courses of study, determining details of continuous assessment etc.

Finance Committee: It will advise the Governing body on financial matters.

College Council: Its function is to advice the Principal on the internal affairs of the College. The College Council consists of the Principal, Professors in-charge (Shift-I & Shift - II), Controller of Examinations, Bursar, all the Heads of the Departments, Senior most Associate Professor of the Departments, President, Secretary and Treasurer of the New College Staff Association, N.C.C. & N.S.S. Officers, Deputy Warden and members of staff who are in the Academic Council and the Senate of the University of Madras.

We must develop thought for the poor and the suffering, chivalrous regard and respect for women, faith in human brotherhood regardless of race or colour, nation or religion, love of peace and freedom, abhorrence of cruelty and ceaseless devotion to the claims of justice.

We cannot preserve real freedom unless we preserve the values of democracy, justice and liberty, equality and fraternity. It is the ideal towards which we should work though we may be modest in planning our hopes as to the result which in the near future are likely to be achieved. "Utopias are sweet dreams" wrote Kant but to strive relentlessly towards them is the duty of the citizen and of the statesman as well". Universities must stand for these ideal causes which can never be lost as men seek wisdom and follow righteousness.

The Fee is payable not later than the fifth working day of each term from the date of commencement of the term or the day fixed for payment.

If a student fails to pay his fees on or before the day fixed for payment, a fine of Rs. 50/- for every working day will be levied and if the fee is not paid within the stipulated dates, the student's name shall be struck off the rolls. If re-admitted, he must pay a re-admission fee of Rs. 200/- in addition to the fees and fine due. He will lose attendance for the days for which he was not on the rolls of the college.

Students withdrawing from the college, during the course shall be required to pay the tuition fees and special fees due for the term. They cannot claim a remission of any portion of the fee.

#### Fee to be paid for the issue of Original T.C. & C.C.

- Within one year of completion (but after three months of the publication of results): Rs. 100/-
- After one year of completion : An additional fee of Rs. 50/-per year

# Fee to be paid for the issue of Duplicate T.C. & C.C.

On production of a certificate from a Gazetted Officer to the effect that the certificate has been lost.

- a. Within one year: Rs. 250/-
- b. After one year: An additional fee of Rs. 100/- per year.

At least a week's time must be given for the issue of any certificate or reply to any other request or query.

#### SCHOLARSHIP

The following scholarships are available for the students. Students are directed to meet the class counselor or scholarship clerk in the office for more details on various scholarships. They are also advised to regularly read the notices regarding scholarships displayed on the Notice Boards.

 National merit-cum-means scholarships to students belonging to. minority communities. A minimum of 50% marks in the qualifying examination is required for applicants. (As the number of scholarships is limited, the selection of eligible candidates may be done on the basis of the marks scored by the applicants in their qualifying examination). This scholarship is available for UG, PG, M.Phil, and Ph.D. courses. Annual income limit. Rs. 1,00,000/-

- National Loan Scholarship for UG and PG students belonging to SC and ST. The applicants should have scored minimum of 50% in the qualifying examination. This scholarship is available only for students staying in reputed / approved hostels. Annual income limit: Rs. 1,00,000/-
- Scholarship for the physically challenged (i.e., students who are deaf / hearing impaired, visually and, Orthopedically challenged). Annual Income limit: Rs. 1,00,000/-
- Residential and non-residential state scholarships for students belonging to SC, ST, and those converted from Hinduism to Christianity: They should be natives of Tamil Nadu or domiciled therein. Annual Income limit: Rs. 2,00,000/- for SC., ST., and Rs. 1,00,000/- for Christian converts.
- Pondicherry state Post-Metric scholarship for students who had their school education in the Union Territory of Pondicherry.
- Directorate of Tribal Affairs, Government of Manipur, gives Post-Metric scholarships for students from Manipur state.
- Administration of the Government of Union Territory of Lakshadweep, Kochi, gives scholarships for students from the Lakshadweep group of Islands.
- Directorate of Higher Education, Kohima, Nagaland, gives Post-Metric scholarships for students from Nagaland state.
- Students belonging to the family of farmer's community are eligible for scholarships under Tamil Nadu Agricultural Laborers — Farmer's Welfare Scheme, offered by the Directorate of Collegiate Education Tamil Nadu.
- Scholarships for Physically challenged students who are natives of Tamil Nadu and whose parent's income does not exceed Rs. 1.00.000/-
- The Directorate of Collegiate Education, Tamil Nadu, gives scholarship (stipend) to full time Ph.D., scholars from all disciplines.
- Ministry of Human Resource Development gives scholarships to students with extraordinary academic achievements in the qualifying examinations (80% and above), through the Directorate of Collegiate Education, Tamil Nadu.

- Indian Council of Cultural Relations (ICCR), Government of India, gives scholarships to UG and PG students from Sri Lanka.
- Ministry of Labour, Government of India, gives scholarships to the children of Beedi / Mine / Cine workers form Tamil Nadu.
- 15. Secondary Grade Teachers Children Scholarship is given to the Children of Secondary Grade Teachers working in Government Recognized Primary and Middle Schools for pursuing M.A., M.Sc., M.Com., M.Ed., M.L., M.C.A., M.Phil courses in Tamilnadu. There is no income ceiling limit, but the students should have secured not less than 60% marks in the U.G. Courses. Selection is made on the merit basis.
- Scholarships for the first-generation students from backward classes. Annual income limit: Rs. 1,00,000/-. A certificate from the Tahsildar to the effect that there is no graduate in the family has to he produced.
- 17. Muslim Educational Association of Southern India (MEASI), the parent body of The New College, awards scholarships to poor and deserving Muslim students pursuing unaided courses in the Day College and all UG and PG course in the Evening College.

# **RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR STUDENTS**

Students will have to attend all classes regularly. The following are the Attendance Regulations of the college.

- A student shall attend all the five periods of each working day. Attendance shall be taken every period as soon as the teacher enters the class. As the attendance slips are collected from the classes immediately after the commencement of the classes, late comers will not be marked present. The attendance position of the each student will be displayed on the Department notice boards every month.
- Students who want to avail leave should submit their leave applications, preferably in advance, to the respective class counsellors.
- Students have to produce medical certificates if the leave on medical grounds exceeds three days.

- 4. If a student absents himself from classes for more than a week without prior permission from the class counselor and Head of the Department, his name will be removed from the rolls. A re-admission fees will be levied for the reinstatement of the names in the rolls.
- A minimum of 75% of attendance is required for all the students. In the case of I year students the minimum required percentage of attendance is 80%.
- 6. According to the University of Madras regulations, a Candidate will be permitted to appear for the End-Semester examinations only if he secures not less than 75% of attendance in each part of the course of study (Part I, Part II, Part III and Part IV) during the semester. A student who secures between 65% and 75% of attendance must pay the prescribed condonation fee and receive the permission orders to write the exam. Those who have attendance between 50% and 65% must pay the prescribed condonation fee and get permission to write the examinations in the next semester. Students who hold less than 50% of attendance will have to repeat the semesters for which they lack attendance after the completion of the course, and appear for the examination after securing the required percentage of attendance.

#### **CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS**

The following are the general code of conduct for the students. Any act of indiscipline inside or outside the college may attract strict action.

- All students must carry their Identity Cards during the college hours. They are required to show their ID cards to the security personnel near the college gate and the college staff (both teaching & non-teaching) whenever demanded. Loss of Identity Cards should be reported to the Principal or the Professor-in-Charge immediately.
- Every student is expected to come to college suitably dressed.
   T-shirts (with or without collar) and Shorts etc. are not allowed.
- Students are expected to exhibit good manners and refined behavior. They should use decent language and abstain

themselves from using profane language, offensive body language and any form of discriminatory expressions. They are expected to be courteous and polite in dealing with fellow students, faculty members and administrative staff. The college expects high moral standards in the students, and so students are advised to inculcate moral values.

- Ragging is a criminal offence. Ragging of any kind is strictly prohibited inside/outside the college. A student found guilty of this crime is liable to be expelled from the college.
- Mobile phones are strictly banned in classrooms, library and examination halls. The defaulters will be fined.
- Students are forbidden from organizing or attending any meeting inside the college campus or collecting money for any purpose without prior permission from the Principal.
- Students are not permitted to enroll themselves as members
  of any political parties nor are they allowed to take
  part/organize in any political agitations inside or outside the
  campus.
- The college campus has been declared as a "No Smoking Zone". Strict disciplinary action will be taken against students found indulging in smoking.
- Students are expected to uphold academic integrity. They should not indulge in plagiarism, malpractice/cheating on exams, abuse of electronic resources and other dishonest activities.
- 10. If any student is found to have engaged in any unlawful activities inside or outside the campus, he /she will be dealt with in accordance with the rule of law in the state and the country, and such students will be suspended / dismissed from the college. The college will not take responsibility for any criminal or non-criminal acts committed by students of the college outside the college campus.
- Possession/use of drugs, alcohol and other intoxicants is strictly banned in the college campus.
- The college Canteen facility is available only to the staff and students of the college. Students may eat only in the

- canteen. Littering on the college premises is a punishable offence.
- Stringent action will be taken if students are found writing and drawing on walls and desks, damaging / defacing college or public property.
- Students are not permitted to park their vehicle in the parking areas allotted for the staff.
- Misconduct with teaching and other supporting staff of the college will be strictly dealt with.
- Students are not permitted to carry weapons of any kind or replicas of weapons on the college Campus at any time.
- The Wi-Fi connectivity available in the college campus should only be used to access academic related materials and information from the internet.
- Students committing Cyber Crimes (illegal activities on the internet) will face disciplinary action including suspension / dismissal from the college.
- Possessing / watching pomographic materials / videos/photos on mobile phones, Tablet Computers and other devices is strictly banned inside the campus.
- Eating, chewing and drinking beverages other that water are strictly forbidden inside the class during class hours.
- Women students pursuing M.Phil., Ph.D., and other programmes are expected to conduct themselves with dignity, modesty and simplicity. They must come to college suitably clad.
- Students should not engage in any trade or business activities within the college premises.
- Character and conduct certificates cannot be claimed as a matter of right. The principal may refuse to issue these certificates without assigning any reason.
- 24. Students may meet or write to the Principal or Professor-in-Charge for redressing their grievances.
- 25. Students are advised to make use of the free periods in reading books, magazines and newspapers available in the reading room of the library.

- 26. Students must read the Circulars displayed on the Notice Boards regularly, Ignorance of orders duly displayed on the Notice Boards shall not be accepted as an excuse for non-compliance. Notices/posters regarding employment opportunities and training programmes supplied by various organizations will be displayed only on the Notice Board of the Career Guidance and Placement Cell located in the ground floor of the Library Block.
- 27. Students are warned against harassing, threatening, abusing or intimidating of fellow students, visitors, staff and others inside the campus. Students engaging in these activities will be seriously dealt with. Note: Under the Government Educational Rules the Principal has full power to inflict the following punishment: Fine, withholding of Certificates, Suspension and Expulsion.

Students detained from appearing for Term End Examinations for want of required percentage of attendance or for want of academic progress are not eligible to contest Sectional Association elections.

The respective Secretaries of the above Sectional Association are eligible to elect from among themselves a Chairman, a Vice-chairman and a General Secretary for the College Students' Union. All UG students are eligible to vote for the respective sectional Association. The PG students are eligible to vote only for PG Association.

#### Shift II

There is a separate College Union for the Self Financing Courses. For each of the following Departments there is a sectional Association with a vice president and a student secretary.

They are: Commerce, Corporate Secretaryship, Computer science, Computer Applications, Information Systems and Management, Business Administration, Bank Management and Bio technology.

In addition to these Association, there is a separate Association for the PG students of the Evening College.

#### STUDENTS' COUNSELLING SCHEME

The Student Counsellor will serve as the local guardian of the students in the college. There is a Students' Counselling Scheme in the college to help the students, tap the latent talent in them and channelize their energy. The aim of the scheme is to strive for overall development of a student ever since he enters the portals of the college. The programme facilitates a group of students to be under the personal care and guidance of a faculty member who would constantly monitor the activities of the students in all respects. Students belonging to each discipline shall be divided into small groups and each shall be kept under the charge of a Staff member of the Department.

The scheme also aims at bridging the gap between the teacher and the taught. Students are advised to make use of this counseling scheme available in their respective Departments for the betterment of their academic pursuit, personality and discipline in a friendly atmosphere. A progress report will he sent by the Principal to the Parents or Guardians at the end of the Term and Model Examinations. The Principal would take into consideration the reports of the Heads of the Departments or Counsellors while issuing Academic, Attendance, Conduct and other certificates.

#### PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Every student of the I year Degree class shall be required to undergo the course of physical training prescribed by the college. His annual attendance and progress certificates shall not be considered complete unless the Principal has certified on the report given by the Director of Physical Education that the student has satisfactorily undergone the prescribed course in physical training and put in threefourths of the attendance, in addition to the usual course of instruction.

No student will be exempted from the course of physical training except those students as may have been declared by the Medical Officer of the College to be unfit to undergo a course of physical training and approved by the university.

#### **MEDICAL INSPECTION**

I Year U.G. & P.G. students have to undergo Medical Inspection without fail. Students who fail to do so are not eligible to write the examinations.

#### **NATIONAL CADET CORPS**

The College provides training to students in the N.C.C. in the Infantry Wing and Armored squadron. Enrolment of cadets is made soon after admission to the college. Smart and capable cadets are entitled to selection for Adventure course, such as all India Advance Leadership Camps, Summer Training Camps of other States, training in the Himalayan Mountaineering Institute, Republic Day Parade contingent at New Delhi etc. Outstanding cadets are entitled to selection for going abroad under Youth Exchange Programme.

#### NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is a programme organized by the Ministry of Education and Youth Services affiliated to the Government of India to offer opportunities and training in service to the community and the nation for students with an aptitude. It is intended to involve the college students in a variety of social service and developmental activities concomitantly with the normal academic programme. The motto of the scheme is "Education through Community Service". Students of the first and second year Degree classes are eligible for admission. A total of 400 students will be enrolled in our college units which will be under the control of three Programme Officers.

# The NSS aims to develop in its volunteers the following:

- A spirit of selfless service to our people in distress, poverty and ignorance, irrespective of region, language, religion and caste.
- A capacity to identify and study community problems, to plan and to carry out welfare projects as a team.
- A willingness to share the benefits of modern higher education with our people who did not get this benefit.

- A dignity for manual work and respect and concern for our rural masses and
- A living faith in the unity of India and our great national heritage.

### NEST

The New College Centre for Environment Science and Technology (NEST) is a science club its aims and objectives are the following:

- To educate the masses and create environmental awareness among them.
- (b) To device methods for the safe and effective disposal of pollutants and to develop indigenous technology for solid waste management like vermin compost.
- (c) To create awareness on Green House Effect and Global Warming.
- (d) To develop new techniques for Rain Water Harvesting (RWH).

The First year UG and the First year PG students of Science departments alone are eligible to enroll themselves as members of NEST. "Young Scientist" and "Enviro Friend" titles would be conferred each year on the outstanding members of the club.

# **DEENIYATH & MORAL INSTRUCTION CLASSES**

. The Muslim Educational Association of Southern India organizes Deeniyath Classes for the students of U.G. and P.G. Degree courses in the College. All Muslim Students are expected to attend these classes regularly.

Moral instruction classes are conducted for students of other communities.

Under the auspices of Deeniyath & Moral Instruction programme common guest lectures are also conducted.

Apart from Annual examinations, contests and essay writing competitions are conducted every year and prizes are awarded.

Students who put in 100% of attendance in Deeniyath & Moral Instruction classes will be awarded cash prizes.

### eUrdu Centre

The Department of Urdu, The New College (Autonomous), Chennai — 14. recently established the e-Urdu Centre to promote Urdu language in general and to impart IT related skills in Urdu in particular.

### **Objectives of the Centre**

- To promote urdu language among staff and students of the college.
- To train students in DTP and other IT related skills in Urdu language.
- To offer add-on Diploma and Certificate Courses in Urdu language for students.

### CAREER GUIDANCE CELL

A career guidance cell is available at the College General Library premises. A team of Professors will guide the students regarding career opportunities.

The cell offers guidance to all students of this college belonging to various faculties to choose a right career.

### The objectives of the cell are as follows:

- (a) To provide training for the students to improve their skill and confidence enable them to to face various competitions.
- (b) To arrange seminars and meetings to enthuse and encourage the students in planning for their future.
- (c) To hold campus selections, interviews organized by various institutions of repute.
- (d) To offer guidance for various Civil Service Examinations conducted both by the Centre and State Governments.
- (e) To provide database of the students sought by various companies.

### UNIVERSITY STUDENTS' INFORMATION BUREAU

### LIBRARY

The college library has is housed in a multi storied building with a plinth area of 18,000 sq.ft specially designed to carry out various functions of an upgraded college library with state of art facilities.

### MISSION OF THE LIBRARY

The mission of the library is to support the objectives of the college by providing high quality services to curricular and co-curricular activities to students and members of the staff with a vision to develop their organizational skills and leadership qualities and to make them value oriented world citizens.

### **ORGANIZATION OF THE LIBRARY**

To facilitate better functionality, the library is divided into several sections viz., circulation section, Acquisition section, Periodical section, Electronic Information section etc. which make the library more user friendly.

### LIBRARY RESOURCES

The library procures and subscribes to comprehensive collection of Books, Periodicals, journals and Electronic resources to support the college's formal programme of instructions and research in various disciplines and promote advancement of knowledge. The library has a total collection of 97,000 books. The major collection covers topics on Mathematical sciences, Physics, Chemistry, Computer science, Plant biology, Zoology, Management science, Language and Literature, English, Tamil, Arabic, Urdu, French. In addition to this a good number of General knowledge books, a judicious collection of books on competitive examinations for students appearing for various types of examinations conducted by TNPSC, TRB,RRB,UPSC, NET, SET etc., are available thus making the library a state of - the art one.

### **BOOK-BANK SCHEME**

Book Bank facility is available for the benefit of economically backward students of SC/ST/OBC communities. Multiple copies of standard text books are acquired for the subjects of Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Plant Biology and Zoology, Computer science, Management science and languages from the funds sanctioned by the management and the UGC. The number of books available in the book-bank scheme is 21,500 on date.

An application form for availing the book facility Book- Bank will be issued at the beginning of every academic year to the deserving students. Applicant should enclose a certificate from a responsible officer stating that the annual income of the parent or guardian does not exceed Rs.72,000 per annum along with the recommendations of the respective Heads of the Departments.

Books available in Book- Bank will be issued from 11.00 a.m. to 1.30 p.m. on all working days for SHIFT - I and 3.00 p.m. to 5.30 p.m. for SHIFT - II students.

A Student borrowing books from the Book-bank shall be fully responsible for their safe custody. The book should not be marked on pages, written upon, defaced or damaged. In the event of any damage or loss of the book the borrower shall replace it with a new copy of the books or pay such compensation as may be decided by the Principal. The borrowers are not allowed to sub-lend the book issued to them.

All books on loan must be returned before the commencement of End semester Examinations. If the books are not returned on time, the students will not be eligible to borrow books in future subsequently.

#### LIBRARY SERVICES

The library follows "open access" facility to all the students and members of the staff to browse the documents in the library. But in order to meet the specific demands of the users, "reference" and "advisory" service is provided to the students and teachers by the library staff.

# TEXT BOOK SERVICE

Every year the library procures multiple copies of recommended text books prescribed for various courses of study and makes available these copies for circulation and for reference within the library. The books are classified and are shelved subject-wise for easy access to the students.

# **ONLINE LITERATURE SERVICE**

Exhaustive search for published materials, for both print and online sources are arranged by the library staff for the benefit of students, research scholars and teachers. List of web documents of scholarly communications, Educational portals, E-resources are also provided. This service has proved to be a great boon to the students and research scholars.

### QUESTION BANK

Question papers of the previous semester examinations of U.G, P.G and M.Phil., Degree courses are bound and made available for the students in the reference section of the library.

### PHOTOCOPYING SERVICE

The library provides photocopy in facility to all users of the library. Students can take photocopies of the required documents whenever required.

# PERIODICALS/JOURNALS/MAGAZINES SECTION

The library subscribes to more than 100 outstanding journals, magazines and 12 newspapers on English, Tamil and Urdu and they are prominently displayed in the reading room for the benefit of the students, research scholars, and teachers. In today's highly competitive world, regular and systematic reading of newspaper can sharpen a student's intellect, refine his emotions, elevate tastes and provide perspectives to prepare him for successful participation in all competitive examinations, job interviews and other social, economical, political and professional life.

### **DEPARTMENTAL LIBRARIES**

All the departments have departmental libraries and each department has a good number of books, journals and News papers. It is under the direct administrative control of respective Heads of Department.

# **ELECTRONIC INFORMATION SERVICE**

The Electronic resources in the library include Educational CDs, Tutorials etc.The library is equipped with computer and communication network and other requisite adequate infrastructure.

# OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue)

Online public access catalogue (OPAC) is the Electronic accessibility to the catalogues of the library. Members can search the library resources in OPAC terminals installed in the library for finding the books and other resources of the library by typing the Title, Author, Subject, Key word etc.

### INTERNET

50

Internet facility is provided to all the students, research scholars and the staff in the library without any charges. They must record their name and other details in the users' register before and after using the internet services. This service is provided to the Students, Research scholars and faculties to facilitate their academic and research activity. The library premises are connected to WI-FI Network.

# DIGITAL INFORMATION RESOURCES AND SERVICES.

The library has subscribed to N-LIST programme of INFLIBNET (Ahmedabad) for retrieval of E- Journals and E- books for the benefit of academic community. Teachers are given separate user ID and Password which helps them to browse and download the electronic journals of American Institute of Physics, Annual Reviews, Cambridge university press, Indian journals, Oxford University, Royal society of chemistry and selected E-books from outstanding publishers. This facility is also being extended to research scholars of M.Phil and Ph.Ds in our college.

### LIBRARY RULES

### **BORROWERS' PRIVILEGES**

- All the students and members of the staff are eligible to enroll as a member of the library and are entitled to use the library facilities and services.
- The library and the reading room will be kept open from 8.30 a.m. to 6.30 p.m. on all working days.
- Books will be issued to all the students on the production of their membership card issued by the library at the library circulation counter for all students from 8.30 a.m to 6.30 p.m. to both SHIFT I and SHIFT II students on all working days.
- Undergraduate (U.G) students will be issued one ticket and they are entitled to borrow one book. Postgraduate students and M.Phil scholars will be issued two tickets/Smart cards against which they can borrow two books.
- The loan period for a book is two weeks only.
- Books may be renewed for a further period of a fortnight provided that
- a) No other students has applied for the book in the meantime.
- b) Not more than one renewal has been made previously for the same book.
- A member borrowing a book from the library shall be fully responsible for its safe custody. In the event of any damage or loss of book, the borrower shall be held responsible and he shall replace it with a new copy of the book or pay such compensation as may be decided by the Principal.
- If the books are returned after the due date, the ticket will be handed over to the member only if an overdue charge, per book per day, is paid.

- The librarian and the library staff has the right to check each student before he leaves the library premises to find out whether he carries any books of the library without the knowledge of Librarian or the library staff.
- A member who has lost his borrower's ticket shall make a
  written request for a duplicate to the librarian. A period
  of one month will be allowed to the member to trace and
  return the ticket. If after this period, it is still untraceable,
  an undertaking in writing shall be given to the effect that
  the member will hold himself responsible for any
  unauthorized borrowing in exchange for the lost ticket.
  On such an undertaking being given a duplicate ticket will
  be issued on a payment of Rs. 10/- through bank challan.
- All the students are asked to enter their Name, Roll No and put their signature in the Register kept at the entrance of the library.
- Strict silence to be observed in the library.
- Bags, over coats, Helmets and similar personal belongings should be kept at the "Property counters" in the library and a token to be obtained from the security personnel.
- Costly things, money etc., are not allowed in the property counter.
- Files, folders, briefcase etc., are not allowed inside the library.
- Use of Laptop will be allowed inside the library for the purpose of Academic use only.
- · No discussions are permitted inside the library.
- Own textbooks, printed materials and issued books are not allowed inside the library.
- Using Cellular phones and audio instruments with or without speaker or headphones is strictly prohibited in the library.

- The books and other materials which are being taken out from the library are to be shown to the library staff at the entrance counter.
- Personal papers and non-library materials should not be left on tables inside the library premises.
- All visitors are informed that Library premises are under CCTV Surveillances.
- The college Library will not be held responsible for any kind of Loss / Damage of your belongings.
- The library premises are to be kept Clean.
- For better use of the Library, user can contact the library staff for any assistance from the library.

### **COLLEGE MAGAZINE**

The College brings out a magazine "Al-jadeed" every year.

There is an Editorial Board of the College Magazine with the
Principal as the Chief Editor. The Principal will nominate some
members of staff as member of the Editorial Board.

# RAILWAY SEASON TICKET CERTIFICATE

Students requiring season ticket certificate should apply in the prescribed form at least a week in advance. Railway concession certificate are also issued to students for going to their native places during end-semester and Summer holidays.

# **ENDOWMENT PRIZE**

Prof .Dr.N. Pandurangan memorial Prize: An endowment was created in the name of late Prof .N. Pandurangan, former Head of the Department of Tamil under the aegis of the M.G.R. Mandram by donation of Rs. 50,000/- which was deposited in the Unit Trust. Out of the dividend received, two prizes are awarded every year, one to the best outgoing M.A. Tamil Student and the other to the best U.G. Student who scores the highest marks in Tamil language in the OEnd Semester Examination.

#### HOSTEL

The Hostel Committee consists of the Principal, the Deputy Warden and two Senior Members of the Staff nominated by the Principal. They hold atleast one meeting every month to pass the accounts, to formulate policies as regards maintenance of the discipline etc. The committee is assisted by the resident superintendents, who shall be the member of the staff.

The Hostel shall be under the direct control of the Principal of the college who is the ex-officio warden of the hostel. Subject to the approval of the warden, the Dy. Warden shall make by-laws for the effective internal management of the hostel.

Students who want accommodation in the hostel should obtain the necessary application form from the hostel office on payment of Rs.500/- and apply after getting admission in the college and enrolled therein. Students joining hostel shall pay the following fees.

### **NEW COLLEGE ALUMNITRUST**

Former students of the college who have been on the rolls of the college are eligible for membership of the trust. The object of the trust is to maintain among the members an active interest in the welfare of their Alma Mater. Students joining the College are requested to become members. They are requested to contact the college office for any clarification in this regard.

# EXAM AND EVALUATION UNDER CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS) Regulations from 2008.2009

All UG and PG Courses shall be conducted on Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). It is an instructional package developed to suit the needs of students to keep pace with the developments in Higher Education and the quality assurance expected of it in the light of liberalization and Globalization in higher education.

The term "Credit" refers to the weightage given to a course, usually in relation to the instructional hours assigned to it. However, in no instance the credits of the course can be greater than the hours allotted to it. Each course is designed under lectures / tutorials / laboratory or field work / seminar / practical training / Assignments / Report writing etc., to meet effective teaching and learning needs.

Non Major Electives during III and IV Semester 2 papers with 2 credits each are taken. It is open to all the students, irrespective of the Department. In case of languages, the students who study Arabic, Hindi, French and Urdu will study one paper on Fundamentals of Tamil during III & IV semesters. The Students who have studied Tamil in Higher Secondary School and taken other language as Part — I will have advanced Tamil. Others will study other Non Major Electives.

Extra Curricular Courses include activities of the NSS, NCC, Youth Red Cross, Rotaract Club and Sports. All the students are encouraged to involve themselves in any one of the extension services for the first four semesters. This will carry 1 credit.

### **Examinations:**

- 1 There shall be Examinations at the end of each Semester, for odd Semester in the month of October / November and for even semester in the month of April / May.
- 2 A Student who does not pass the examination in any course(s) may be permitted to appear in the subsequent examination to be held in October / November or April / May. However students who have arrears in Practical shall be permitted to take their arrear Practical examinations in the respective semester.
- 3 All students should get registered for the first semester examination. If registration is not possible owing to shortage of attendance beyond condonation limit /regulation prescribed or belated joining or on medical grounds, such students are permitted to move to the next semester. However they shall redo the missed semester after the completion of the course.
- 4 PG students shall be required to take up Project Work and submit the Project Report during their second year. The Head of the Department shall allot the guide who in turn will suggest the project Work to the students. Two typed copies of the Project Report shall be submitted to the department before the due date and one copy will be forwarded to the Controller of Examinations. The project paper carries 100 marks.

- 5 For the Project Report, the maximum marks will be 75 percent and for the Viva-Voce 25 percent. Each student shall be required to appear for Viva-Voce Examination (in defense of the Project only).
- 6 Each PG student shall appear for an internship training during the vacation of the II Semester for a minimum period of 15 days and shall submit the report to the controller of examinations. Each student is awarded 2 credits on submission of the report.

### Condonation:

Students must have 75% of attendance in each part of the course of study to appear for the End-Semester Examinations. Students who have 65% to 74% of attendance shall apply for condonation in the prescribed form with the prescribed fee and receive the permission orders to write the Exam. Students who have 50% to 65% of attendance must pay the prescribed condonation and get permission to write the Examinations in the next semester. Students who have below 50% of attendance are not eligible to appear for the examination. They shall redo the semester(s) after rejoining for which they lack attendance without proceeding for the next semester as the case may be. Students who lack attendance owing to medical grounds shall produce medical certificate issed by the authorized medical attendant duly certified by the Principal of the college and shall be permitted to proceed to the next semester and to complete the course of study after securing required percentage of attendance.

#### **Examination Fees**

Examination fees without fine or with the fine or Rs. 500/should be paid on or before the prescribed dates for each semester. No extension of date will be entertained under any circumstances.

### **Evaluation**

Evaluation for each course shall be done by continuous internal assessment by the course teacher concerned as well as by an end semester examination and will be consolidated at the end of the course. The performance of a student in each course is evaluated in terms of percentage of marks with a provision for conversion to grade points.

The components for continuous internal assessment (CIA) are:

# UG & PG 2014 Batch onwards

Test & Model - 12 Marks
Assignment - 8 Marks
Regularity - 5 Marks
Total - 25 Marks

In addition to continuous evaluation component, (CIA) the end semester examination, which will be a written — type examination of at least 3 hour duration, would form an integral component of the evaluation. The ratio of marks to be allotted to continuous internal assessment and to end semester examination is 25:75

The procedures for the conduct of the Semester Examination and valuation will be evolved by the office of the Controller of Examination.

Grades will be awarded separately for Part-I, Part-II, Part-III and Part-IV. Marks obtained in Part — III Allied Courses, Core Courses, Elective Courses alone will be taken into consideration for awarding the classification in the overall performance of the student with grading system.

# Passing Minimum for candidates admitted from 2014 -15 batch

There is no passing minimum for CIA Marks (25). The passing minimum for End semester Exam shall he 40% of 75 marks (30 marks) and overall pass is 40%. In PG course, a candidate shall he declared to have passed in each course if he secures not less than 50% out of 75% (38 marks) in the End Semester Examinations and not less than 50% in the aggregate, taking Continuous assessment and End Semester Examinations mark together.

#### **Instant Examination**

UG/PG Students with arrear in only one paper of final semester will be permitted to write the instant exam on the payment of Rs. 1000/- for that paper. The Instant exam will be normally conducted within 15 days of declaration of results of the final

semesters. However, the re—do and mal practice cases, if any, are not eligible to appear for Instant exam.

### Grading (GPA/CGPA)

Once the marks of the CIA and semester Examinations for Each Course are available, they will be consolidated. The marks thus obtained will then be graded.

Total performance within a semester and continuous performance starting from the first semester are indicated by Grade Point Average (GPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA).

### Grievance Redressal Cell

The students are informed that there will be a Grievance Letter box in the General Library.

The functions are:

- (a) To deal with matters relating to the redressal of genuine and valid grievances of the students concerning all academic and examination related matters and suggest corrective measures.
- (b) To make a systematic enquiry into any written complaint lodged by any student regarding his/her continuous internal assessment or Final examination marks and suggest appropriate corrective actions.
- (c) The letter of Grievance should contain the name, roll number, class of the student and should be duly signed with date. The letter of grievance may be handed over to the Convenor, in person or dropped in the grievance letterbox.
- (d) The convenor shall collect the letter and number it serially, go through the letter and arrange for the redressal of grievance of the students and report the same in the monthly meeting of Grievance Appeal Committee to be convened on the first Monday of every month. Genuine Grievances will he properly redressed.

# DISCIPLINARY ACTION ON MALPRACTICE IN EXAMINATION

- Student shall not indulge in any form of malpractice during C.I.A. Tests, Model and End Semester Examinations.
- The student will be disqualified from the examination if he uses Mobile Phone and keeps the same with or without knowledge of the invigilator.
- The following punishments will be given to the students, when they indulge in malpractices in C.I.A. test, Model and Semester Examinations.

### **EXAMINATION COMMITTEE**

Examination Committee has been formed based on the recommendation of Academic council of the college. Principal of

the college will be the chairman and controller of Examination will be the Convenor. The member of the committee are Professor's in-charge (Shift-I&II), Bursar, College Council Secretary, Co-ordinator IQAC, Deputy warden, Assistant Controllers of Examinations, member university Academic Council, member examination cell and President of the New College Staff Association. The procedure for the conduct of the semester Examination and valuation will be evolved by the office of the controller of examination in consultation with the Examination Committee.

### **ANTIRAGGING COMMITTEE**

An Anti Ragging Committee has been formed in the college. Students indulging in ragging activities are liable to be punished under the orders of Central and State Governments and the University of Madras. Incidents of ragging or attempted ragging on the college campus should be reported to the convener of anti ragging committee.

### STUDENTS PLACEMENT CELL

The cell acts as a platform to create opportunities for our students to be placed in the various companies at national and global level. This cell is headed by a Campus Placement Officer. This cell organizes campus recruitment drive for part time and full time job offers for our students. It also offers leadership and training programmes for the students.
