The academic year 2018-19 has been a year of vibrant activities and progressive

initiatives in the college. I am delighted to present the Annual Report on the various activities of

the college during this year.

Reopening of the College:

The college reopened after Summer Vacation for the 67<sup>th</sup>Academic year on 18 June 2018.

Second and Third year classes started on the same day, and the first year UG classes commenced

on 25 June 2018.

**Appointments:** 

The parent body, MEASI appointed me as Principal, Zahiruddin Sherif, as Vice Principal

(Administration), Dr. S. Basheer Ahmed, as Vice Principal (Academics), Mr. A. R. Abdul Lathif

as Controller of Examinations, and Dr. P.A. Abdulla Mahaboob as Assistant Controller of

Examinations. Mr. S. A. Sheik Mohamed, was given the additional charge of the Students'

Attendance. All of us took charge on 1st June 2019.

14 new faculty members were appointed in various departments in the academic year

under management staff category. The Regional Joint Director of Collegiate education approved

the appointment of 8 teachers in various departments, under aided category during the current

academic year.

18 faculty members of the college attended Refresher & Orientation Courses during the

academic year. 03 faculty members from English who went on deputation for two years to

complete Ph.D. under UGC-FDP scheme, re-joined duty on 1<sup>st</sup> March 2019.

**Admissions:** 

Admissions for the 2018-19 academic year commenced on 28th May 2018. A total

number of 1041 students in shift I and 918 students in shift II were admitted to various UG and

PG programmes. The admissions were closed on 31<sup>st</sup> August 2018.

**Introduction of Additional sections:** 

The University of Madras has granted us permission in the current academic year to start

one additional section each in the B.Com - General and B.Com - Corporate Secretaryship courses

in Shift – II with a sanctioned strength of 70 students in each section.

Proposals for New Courses from the Next Academic Year 2019-2020

The college has submitted proposals to the University of Madras to offer B.A. (Tamil),

B.A. (Business Economics), B.Com. Accounting and Finance), B.Sc. (Information Technology),

M.Com (General), and M.Sc. (Botany) courses in the college from 2019-20 academic year. The

college is awaiting final orders from the University approving these proposals.

Extension of Autonomous Status by the UGC:

A six-member expert committee appointed by the UGC, visited the college on 29<sup>th</sup> and

30<sup>th</sup> October 2018 to inspect the college for granting extension of Autonomous status. On the

basis of the favorable report submitted by the committee, UGC granted extension of Autonomous

Status to our college till 2023 (for Five years).

Students' Union activities:

Continuing the tradition of promoting democratic values among the students, the college

conducted Election to the Students' Union on 25th July 2018. The Union activities were

inaugurated by Sri U Sagayam, IAS, Vice Chairman, Science City, on 17<sup>th</sup> September 2018.

**Graduation Day** 

Graduation Day for Shift I and shift II students, who passed out in April 2017, was

conducted in September 2018. Thiru Sunil Paliwal, IAS, Principal Secretary, Department of

# Preparation for the 4th Cycle of NAAC accreditation

The college has started preparations for the upcoming 4<sup>th</sup> cycle of NAAC accreditation in 2021. As a first step in the preparations, teams of staff members were deputed to attend workshops held in different Universities on different aspects of NAAC accreditation. Two initial special meetings were conducted to sensitize the IQAC members and Heads of Departments on the revised guidelines, in which Dr Anvar Sadhath (English), Dr. Ibrahim Naveed (Zoology), and Mr. Sivakumar (Business Administration), made presentations. Considering the challenges in meeting the revised expectations of the NAAC, the college has constituted a core committee and seven criteria-wise committees each of which consisting of a Team Head and members. The IQAC has also arranged two special workshops to create awareness among all the faculty members of the college on the revised regulations of the NAAC. Dr. Sethuraman, Professor, Gandhigram Rural Institute, and Dr. Madhukar, former Adviser, NAAC, served as resource persons.

Vice Principal (Academics), Dr. S. Basheer Ahamed and the IQAC Head, Mr. S.A. Sheik Mohamed attended a special meeting conducted by the UGC at Maulana Azad National Urdu University, Hyderabad to discuss issues concerning Autonomous status granted to colleges. Mr. S.A. Sheik Mohamed has also attended a workshop on MOOC courses held at Maulana Azad National Urdu University, Hyderabad. The Principal, Dr. Abdul Jabbar and Janab. Mandy Mohamed Aslam, Asst. # Seminars, Workshops and Special Lectures

During the academic year, a number of academic programmes were conducted in the college utilising the funds allotted from the UGC Autonomous Grant. These programmes include national seminars conducted by Departments of Arabic, Chemistry, and Computer Science; National conference on "Literature and identity Politics" organised by the Department of English; special lectures and lecture series conducted by Departments of Zoology, Mathematics, Business Administration, Economics and History; State and National level workshops organised by Commerce, Business Administration, Mathematics, Plant Biology, Hindi and French; symposium was organised by the Department of History, and Computer Science and Urdu Day celebrations was conducted by Department of Urdu. IQAC of the college conducted an awareness programme for students on Drugs and Addiction on 1st March 2019. Dr. Venkadesh Babu, IRS, Assistant Commissioner of Narcotics, Air Customs, Madurai served as the resource person. The resource person holds the Guinness Record for giving maximum number of lessons on Drug Awareness.

The various sectional associations of the college initiated their activities through inaugural meetings with invited resource persons from various other colleges. The PG Association of the college organised a PG Association Day on 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2019 in which Dr. Bryan Oliver Peppin, former Head of English of our college and V.S. Sambandan, CAO, Hindu group were the Chief Guests.

Besides these events the sectional associations, and departments have enriched the academic year with diverse activities. The Department of Commerce conducted Golden Jubilee year celebrations on 12<sup>th</sup> March 2019. Janab. H.H. Janab. Mohammed Abdul Ali Azimjah, Prince of Arcot presided over the function. The Department of Tamil organised a *Pattimandram* (Lichtandian) on 14<sup>th</sup> March 2019. Poet, M. Ramalingam, served as the judge in the event.

#### Co-curricular & Extra-curricular Activities

Various cultural activities and competitions were also conducted to give our students an opportunity to display their talent and to compete with students of other colleges. The college organised an inter-collegiate Talents Day under the name, FINUN on 4<sup>th</sup> March 2019. Students from various city colleges and our own students displayed their talents in the event. Guru Nanak College students bagged the overall championship in the event, and SRM college, Ramapuram Campus won the second place. Other cultural programmes conducted in the college include, a Chemfest conducted by Department of Chemistry, 'Kairos 19K' intercollegiate Literary competitions conducted by the Department of English, Urdu Mushaira arranged by the Department of Urdu, and intercollegiate cultural competitions conducted by the Department of Commerce. The Corporate Secretaryship Department has brought out their annual in-house magazine, Corpians Digest.

The college has organised an Islamic Youth Conference on 14 March 2019. Four eminent speakers delivered lectures in the conference.

### Award of Ph.D. to the Teaching Staff

12 Faculty members of the college secured Ph.D. Degrees from various Universities in India. A few more faculty members have submitted their Ph.D. theses and are waiting for their viva-voce.

#### UGC & other Grants received during 2018-2019

Under various schemes like Faculty development Programme, Minor research Project, and Autonomous Grant, the college has received a sum of Rs. 37, 72, 845/- during the current academic year, 2018-19.

#### **Placement Activities**

The Placement Cell of the college has initiated on-campus placement drives by companies including Just Dial, IDBI Federal, Sutherland, Zoho, Capgemini, CAMS, Troika Pharmaceuticals, Cars India, Trade Plus, Sundaram Business Services, and Funds India. Some of these drives are scheduled after the semester examinations. The cell facilitated off-campus

placement initiatives by companies like ATMECS, TCS, Accenture, Wipro, Integra Software Services, and Maruti Suzuki, and CITY Group. The placement cell has arranged a special training programme for the computer science and computer applications students to prepare them for IT-Jobs prior to the placement drive by Zoho, a reputed IT firm in Chennai. It is heartening to note that 18 students from our college could clear the Pan India aptitude test conducted by TCS, the largest IT Company in India, to select Software professionals. In the placement drives conducted this year, so far, about 150 students have got offers from various companies. The results of some more placement drives are yet to be received. The highest salary offered to our students by the companies that recruited our students this year was 6.4 Lakhs per annum, and the lowest was 1.5 Lakhs, per annum.

## **Relief Work during Calamities**

Reiterating our commitments to the society, the college, with the support of Staff members and NSS unit, raised funds and helped the victims of Gaja cyclone and Kerala Floods. During the Gaja Cyclone, Relief materials worth more than 4 lakhs were distributed to 500 families in Vedaranyam. Relief materials were also distributed to flood affected areas in Kerala. In addition, the Staff members and students of the college donated Rs. 3 lakh to Kerala Chief Minister's Relief fund.

#### Nomination of Teachers as Resource Persons & Subject Experts

Many faculty members of our college served as Resource Persons in the seminars and conferences organised by various colleges within and outside the state. They also served as subject experts in various academic bodies, like TNPSC, Board of Studies in various colleges, and staff selection committees in different organizations. The principal, Dr. A. Abdul Jabbar was invited as the Chief Guest for the college Day Celebrations of Islamiah College, Vaniyambadi. Our faculty members also presented papers in national and international seminars during this academic year.
